- Substance Use Treatment: We complete a biopsychosocial assessment and utilize the ASAM criteria to establish level of care. We provide Level two treatment (IOP) to all initial client's regardless of the drug of choice due to the evidence based curriculum we currently use "Living in Balance". IOP includes a didactic and processing session to empower client's to establish a recovery program, gain additional support, and develop a relapse prevention plan. Once a client completes IOP, we have level one groups (Outpatient) available in LaSalle and Ottawa. Ottawa has an opiate specific group designed to meet the needs of this population.
- 2. *Co-occurring Disorders* are treated simultaneously based on the clients' needs and desire. We have the ability to provide limited medication services, community support, case management, therapy, and limited transportation the IOP.

**OSF HealthCare Behavioral Health:** (1100 E.
